Encouragement from Pastor Ross

May is the month that gardeners and farmers prepare the soil for planting. Gardeners decide which vegetables they will grow this year. Seeds & plants are purchased. Our family goes to an Amish family near Little Valley to buy their hanging baskets of flowers. By Memorial Day we like to hang them on our porch in hopes that the nights of frost are over for the summer. It is fun and beautiful to do. It

all reminds me of the most important seeds we can plant in our minds every month...the Words of God. Jesus told a story about planting seed: Luke 8:11 "Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God."

Jesus then talks about 4 types of soil for the Bible to be planted into: 1. WAYSIDE soil = people who are on the fringe of Jesus, meaning not real serious about God. Satan takes the Words of God out of their minds because they don't believe it is God's Word.

- 2. ROCKY soil = people who have no roots in Jesus so they fall away from the Words of God when temptations come to them.
- 3. THORNY soil = people who think about the cares of this life and the riches, pleasures they want so the Words of God get choked out and never come to maturity.
- 4. GOOD soil = people who have treasured the Words of God and with noble and good heart desire to obey what Jesus says. They use the Word of God to produce a crop of the Fruit of the Spirit, even if it takes a while. They are patient and walk in the Spirit.

Say a prayer something like this: "Dear Lord, as I plant my flowers & garden this month of May, help me to have special plantings of Your Words in my mind so that I produce in abundance the fruit of the Holy Spirit in my life. Amen"
